Our school is going to promote 'Musical Instrument Borrowing Scheme' to provide students with a one-year musical instrument lending service.

Aims:

- 1. To lighten the burden of students' families and save parents'/students' time of buying instruments.
- 2. To teach students to treasure public property and cultivate their sense of responsibility.
- 3. To protect the environment by reusing the instruments and extending the period of using the instruments to cultivate students' sense of protecting the environment and treasuring public property.
- 4. To encourage daily practice at home.

- 4. Ukulele
- 5. Guitar
- 6. Flute
- 7. Clarinet
- 8. Saxophone

Musical Instrument Borrowing Scheme

Regulations:

- 1. Our school will purchase and lend the musical instruments to students from the beginning to the end of the school term (September 2020 to June 2021).
- 2. Each student who is going to borrow the musical instruments (harp, flute, clarinet and saxophone) will have to pay \$200 deposit [The deposit will be returned at the end of the school term]. The musical instruments will be distributed to students at the beginning of the school term. At the end of the school term, students should return them to our school.
- 3. For any damage to the musical instruments, students will have to pay for the cost of the musical instruments.
- 4. If any damage are found when students get the musical instruments, they should list them clearly on the Letter of Premises.
- 5. If students lose the musical instruments, they have to pay for the cost of the musical instruments or the money will be deducted from the deposit. If the payable amount exceeds the deposit, our school will ask their parents to pay the extra money.
- 6. For students who quit school without returning the musical instruments they have borrowed, the deposit will be forfeited.
- 7. All the musical instruments must be returned in three days after the day of the final exam because our teachers need to count the musical instruments and lend them to other students. Otherwise, the musical instruments will be regarded as being lost and the students will have to pay for them.
